Please confirm with your CEO/CFO that they have completed and returned the survey. • Change Plans will be due November 1st, will probably be pass/fail. After initial review, you will have 3 weeks to make changes and the final scoring will be done before Christmas. This will be a continuation of the current change plan, you are not starting over. You will be tweaking dates and potential drivers to reflect current situation and how to move your organization forward. • Recovery Coach Training: The Recovery Coach Training Academy has been scheduled for September 30-October 3 and the Recovery Coach Training of Trainers has been scheduled for October 12-13. Both trainings will be held in Wenatchee, specific location TBD. Participants will be selected through an application process by NCACH staff and members of the Central Washington Recovery Coalition. All participants will be expected to complete both the Academy and the Training of Trainers programs and provide a minimum of one Recovery Coach Training in North Central Washington within one year of completing the training.
