This amendment documents the verbal explanation communicated at the mid-term of the project, of how the actual work of the grant dictated different use of the funds from what was originally envisioned.

<u>Personnel Costs:</u> (exceeded projected expenses)

As described in the project's mid-point and final reports, the engagement dynamics of our counties dictated that we take a very local grass-roots approach that resulted in building local "county" coalitions that allowed us to truly generate understanding and buy in of the vision surrounding the transformation of healthcare we are pursuing. It became clear that out-side consultants were not the right people to facilitate such process. As a result we had to do more staff leg work and more meetings in each county as anticipated. The impact on the budget is that we spent more on personnel costs and much less on consultants.

Travel: (underspent projected costs)

We spent less on travel as expected. We had anticipated bringing in consultants from out of the area that would have incurred more travel costs.

Event Expenses: (exceeded projected expenses)

With the exception of Chelan and Douglas counties, engagement in Kittitas and Okanogan counties dictated we have meetings and forums during the lunch hour in Okanogan and late dinner time meetings in Kittitas. This helped us engage people that would normally not have been available to participate. Consequently, our event costs included more expenses to provide light lunches and dinners in these counties. That was primarily what caused this budget item to be more than anticipated.

In-kind resources: (Community Choice)

Community Choice contributed additional resources including some overhead costs, additional staffing time that is documented in this final financial report. Additional in-kind contributions included parallel work on a Community Health Needs Assessment effort that added value to the Community of Health planning process. This is ongoing work that will continue to be relevant to the Accountable Community of Health work in the future
