




Q4: What do you believe to be the primary means of transportation for the majority of your clients? [SELECT ONE]

Survey Responses and Themes:

- Transportation/Physical Access
- Family Dynamics
- Fear

"The population served heavily relies of public transportation. However, most of these families have small children which make it difficult to go out and get boxes of food while having the little ones accompany them. I believe that a delivery system will highly benefit these families; making food more accessible."

"For clients without transportation who are hesitant to go out into the public, I feel that this would be an awesome resource for them."

"We do delivery to elderly, boxes are too heavy for them to pick up and we don't want them to be exposed to Covid for coming to the food bank to pick up a box of food."

"The families I work with have little ones at home and it makes it very difficult for them to take to any public place while managing their health and safety with current COVID concerns. Also the families I work with rely on a family or friends/public transportation and they are unable to take their small children with them for safety reasons."

"I believe they would get more food bank food if delivered. Some can't be out that long to wait in lines and be out with other people and germs."

"Some clients are unable to leave their home due to compromised immune systems and/or lack of social support"

"it would be safer for them to not go into the public since some are worried to go out right now."

"I imagine that neighborhood deliveries would be welcomed by many of our clients. Access and carefully planned routes would be a great idea!"






Q4: Do you anticipate needing to use food assistance programs anytime within the next 6 months?


Q5: What is your primary means of transportation? [SELECT ALL THAT
