NCW Economic Development District-Paul Moore

- Region wide in Okanogan, Chelan and Douglas Counties and Colville Confederated Tribes.
- We educate, spotlight regional development strategies, collaborate-regional partnerships and grant management.
- North Star Opportunity Zones: Capital investment into opportunity zones. There are places for us to grow. These are opportunities to address the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH). An idea is to have housing where there is a business below and living area above.

Our Valley Our Future-Steve Maher

- Our Valley Our Future is a grassroots organization. The organization has a board of directors, executive committee and coordinator. There is a wide range and diverse group of board members.
- Main tasks of the organization are to research, organize, connect, facilitate, fund, communicate, and champion.
- There are 150 projects and programs developed by community members. The projects cover jobs, economy, education, arts and culture, public safety and outdoor recreation. These are done by collaborative and holistic approaches.
- A survey to capture the community voice has been done. With over 5,000 responses with 23% of identifying as Latino.
- The Game-Changer Projects are created to move the needle in the community.

- Successful outcomes of projects are real action, movement, improvements and better quality of life for residents.
- There are action items available that need a lead partner.
 - o Expanded Medical Sector
 - Reducing Drug Use
 - Enhance Mental Health Services

NCW Hispanic Chamber of Commerce-Wilma Cartagena

- Mission is to promote hispanic owned businesses in Wenatchee.
 - The chamber has been involved for 20 years. Different than the Wenatchee Commerce of Chamber.
- The NCW Hispanic Chamber of Commerce is transitioning to the Empowerment Fund. To fundraise and provide scholarships to students to go to college.
