Early Warning System Workgroup Charter

Goal

Develop recommendations for an Early Warning System that allows a feedback loop and triage process to identify and resolve system issues as they arise. Operationalize the system by July 1, 2017 in order to collect six months of baseline data

Key Deliverables

- Draft recommendations on Early Warning Indicators – 8/31/2017
- Finalized Recommendations on Early Warning Indicators – 10/31/2017

Authority

The Early Warning System Workgroup is a workgroup of the Fully-Integrated Medicaid Advisory Committee. The Early Warning System Workgroup is not a decision-making body in itself, but will provide recommendations that will inform the development of the Early Warning System in North Central Washington.
