The workgroup conducted 5 in person interviews out of 18 total applications and brought forward John Schapmann as the recommendation to the NCACH board. Motion by Sheila Chilson to accept the recommendation of the workgroup, second by Jeff Davis. Unanimously approved. b. On September 30, 2016, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) approved Washington's request for a five-year demonstration waiver that allows up to \$1.5 billion of federal investment to help drive Medicaid transformation. This is an agreement in principle by CMS, to be followed by negotiation of special terms and conditions, the actual contract for the demonstration waiver. c. NCACH Budget Update	 Recent EQRO audit by DBHR with written report expected in 6-9 months Upcoming meeting with HCA and all commissioners on October 17-18 to review of Grant County concerns regarding NCWBHO practices NCWBHO governing board meeting pushed back a week to Oct. 10th due to current site audit of BHO. Parkside- Douglas County has agreed to relinquish its lease on Parkside so that that City of Wenatchee (which owns the property) can move forward with construction of inpatient mental health beds there. The goal is still to have the construction done about one year from now. BHO should be receiving residual Grant County grant funds from Spokane BHO. All MCO presentation is scheduled for the BHO Advisory/QMOC board on Oct. 31. Barry presented the board with a current expenditure report to date as well as a current budget projection. Bruce Buckles noted the substantial cost included for the January workshop, and it was explained that this was still subject to approval from HCA and CMS, and that these would be special funds allocated to each ACH recently for work by 1/31/17 on our primary initiative. Barry indicated this was a rather high estimate to be on the safe side, and that the point of the cost is to enable a wide variety of partners – even those working in agencies that re not well funded – to be part of
