Purpose

Shared Learnings allow the North Central ACH to explore and share opportunities to support action and innovation to improve health in the North Central region.

Intended Learning Outcomes

Through shared learnings, the North Central ACH will be able to:

- Build an increased understanding about the different sectors that serve on the North Central ACH and/or impact the health of the community in the North Central region, including business models, operational considerations, contractual authorities, funding streams, priorities
- Develop shared capacity through leaning about innovative programs happening within the community, at the state level or in other parts of the country (or world) as well as core board function areas.
- Receive updates from the state and/or local officials on upcoming programs that will impact the ACH and our community and how best to respond.

Format and Procedures

- Shared learnings should occur at Governing Board meetings, if feasible.
- During Governing Board meetings, shared learning formats could include:
 - Panel discussions, table top discussions, presentations from leading experts or governing board members, and reading materials.
- Time will be offered to presenters to ask for presentation feedback if requested.
- Presenters will also be expected to connect their topic to ACH work as much as possible.
- Presenters will be asked to avoid "show and tell"
- Council members should debrief learnings to evaluate knowledge gained and learning format strengths and possible improvements.
