Introduction-All

In honor of Recovery Month, the Okanogan County Coalition for Health Improvement Leadership Council has decided to have those working on opioid prevention and education in Okanogan County to touch on the work that is being done. The North Central Accountable Communities of Health (NCACH) is investing and funding different projects that are moving the needle. One of which is opioid projects. These projects can be for opioid prevention, education, recovery and treatment. Another Opioid Rapid Grant Cycle will be open in October 2019.

School-Based Opioid Prevention-Rachel Levi

- Rachel is an independent contractor and just wrapped up a similar project who funded Methow Valley school based project. Partners are Room One, Family Health Centers, Okanogan County Community Action Council and Methow Valley School District.
- An assessment will be done for school based efforts. From that assessment, development of a school based project will begin. Implementation of the project will be in 2020 or 2021, with additional funding. We are supporting 1 student led prevention. Methow Valley has the student led project creating an informational campaign around mental health and substance use.
- Relationship building is the first step. Currently, reaching out to school districts and administrators in the county who are knowledgeable in opioid prevention.
- What are you currently doing?
 - Data collection. It is hard to plan during the school year.
- How do you need to support?
 - School administrator and leadership introductions, school events or meetings. The more connections the better to do the work.
- How do you measure success?
 - The project development phase is just starting. In the project plan we will develop milestones and then we will know what to measure.

Rapid-Cycle Opioid Project-Oroville Care Coalition

Opioid Treatment Network-Family Health Centers

- Opioid Crisis Project started with a grant from the State. Building on partnerships and focusing on increasing MAT. Now it will expand to recovery and prevention.
 - Focus was treatment and learning about prevention. Now the focus is working to decrease barriers.
- Prevention of use and opioid related morbidity and mortality. The work is being done through Narcan Leave-Behind (enable the medical staff to leave narcan and information). Infectious disease transmission is high, so working on reducing transmission. This is done through the syringe exchange program.
- Okonogan Clinical Opioid Crisis Response Conference: Reduce stigma and newer approach to see substance use disorder (SUD) as a chronic disease.
- Prevention: Opioid misuse prevention module for parents, better pain management without opioid, safe storage and disposal of opioids.
- Treatment: Maintain focus on increasing to MAT. Decrease barriers to obtain the medication. Enhance coordination between medical and behavioral centers. Care coordination improvement between organizations.
- Recovery: Recovery Coach positions, promote clubhouse, possibly create a Recovery Coalition and use the Pathways Community HUB.

Rapid Cycle Opioid Project-North Valley Hospital

- The goal is to provide education on opioid use, drug abuse, and overdoses directly to high school students in the Tonasket School District as well as to their parents and guardians. The education will focus on the stigma of drug use, available resources, and safe drug disposal.
- North Valley Hospital is partnering with the Tonasket School District. This will be done by school assemblies, after school events and education mailer.
 - School assembly will be done by Ron James to the high school, middle school and elementary school separately. The focus will be on how we make positive choices.
 - Educational mailers will focus on information for parents, resources, and safe drug disposal
 - After school events are still being planned.
